Free Christmas Tree Recycling

All around Douglas County there are many opportunities to recycle your old Christmas tree for free! Around the Roseburg area drop boxes have been placed around the community for your convenience by Roseburg Disposal to collect Christmas Trees for free recycling. This has been a service provided by the local business for many years which is a great gift to the community and much appreciated.

The collected trees are then ground into mulch by Douglas County Public Works which is available for anyone to pick up during regular operating hours at the landfill. To pick up your free mulch, call 957-7712 before you go to make sure the loader is available to load your vehicle. The mulch is free of charge for self-loading, but a \$15 fee applies if the County loads it for you.

This year, Wildlife Safari is also getting in to the action once again by accepting Christmas trees for free drop off in their parking lot. The Safari will use your trees with their large animals during an event coming up on the January 16th. When dropping off the trees to Wildlife Safari, check in with them and you will get a 2 for 1 coupon to the event for having donated a tree.

As always, your tree along with any other yard debris and woody material can be recycled for free at any one of the County transfer stations. At each of these transfer stations, you may sort your waste from your recyclable thus saving the county money and preserving natural resources.

PLEASE NOTE: No ornaments, flocking, stands, lights, plastic bags, metal, or any other refuse should accompany your tree. This material contaminates the mulch.

You may take your trees to these locations for free drop off through January 8th:

- Corner of Pine and Spring
- Wildlife Safari

Any Douglas County Transfer Station (Year round collection of yard debris)

Last year over 1300 cubic yards of trees were recycled through this program.
