


3 USE YOUR RECYCLE POWER!

WHAT TO RECYCLE ~ AND HOW TO SORT & PREPARE IT

NEWSPAPER	Any inserts that come in a newspaper can be recycled with it, too. Put newspapers in paper bags and include other all-newsprint items such as coupon books. NO: plastic bags or string, please.
CORRUGATED CARDBOARD	Only 3-layer cardboard  (PLEASE FLATTEN) and paper grocery bags accepted. OK: Tape, staples, stickers. NO: waxed, food-contaminated, or fiberboard (e.g., cereal/shoe/tissue boxes, notepad backs).
WHITE PAPER	Separate from mixed paper. Include WHITE copy, letterhead and computer paper. OK: staples. NO: colored inks, paint, crayon, envelopes, paper clips, tape, glue, plastic, rubber bands or fiberboard.
MIXED PAPER & FIBERBOARD	Separate from white paper. Inc. colored paper, unwanted mail, sticky notes, envelopes, folders, index cards, notebook paper & shredded paper. Fiberboard includes cereal/shoe/tissue boxes, notepad backs, toilet roll/paper towel cores. OK: staples, inks, tape. NO: paper clips, glue, plastic, rubber bands, newspapers, magazines, pet food bags.
MAGAZINES & CATALOGS	Separate from other paper categories. Include all glossy paper items, such as posters, calendars, brochures. Put in paper bags or loose. NO: plastic bags or wrappers, or string. Recycle phone books separately.
TIN CANS	Rinse well, remove labels, and include the lids. NO: scrap metal or appliances.
ALUMINUM	Include rinsed non-refundable cans, cleaned aluminum foil, pie pans, and frozen dinner trays. NO: scrap metal, appliances, or cans with plastic or paper attached (e.g., frozen juice).
GLASS BOTTLES & JARS	Remove lids and rinse well. Separate into these 3 groups: CLEAR & BLUE • BROWN & AMBER • GREEN OK: labels. NO: window glass, light bulbs, mirrors, dishes, drinking glasses, ceramics, metal.
PLASTIC BOTTLES #1 - #7	Plastic bottles and jars must have necks. Look for the number 1 through 7 in the triangle on the bottom. (Recycle milk/water jugs separately.) Remove caps. Rinse well and flatten. OK: colored bottles, labels. NO: tubs, lids, buckets, plant pots, trays, motor oil containers, plastic bags, Styrofoam, or toys.
PLASTIC JUGS	Non-colored #2 plastic milk and water jugs only. Remove lids, rinse well and flatten.
PLASTIC BAGS & FILM/WRAP	Most grocery stores take empty, clean and dry plastic grocery bags. Transfer sites and recycling depots take these AND plastic produce bags, ice bags, dry cleaner bags, clean trash bags, shrink wrap, and lumber wrap. NO: ties, staples, hard/rigid plastic, tarp material, bubble wrap, Styrofoam, foam wrap.
YARD WASTE <small>LANDFILL & TRANSFER SITES ONLY!</small>	Grass, yard clippings; branches up to 12" diameter. <i>OR TRY COMPOSTING!</i>
LUMBER WASTE <small>LANDFILL & TRANSFER SITES ONLY!</small>	Wood construction/demolition materials only. NO: bolts, hinges, wire, concrete, and plastic, please. (They damage our tub grinder!)
SCRAP METAL <small>LANDFILL & TRANSFER SITES ONLY!</small>	Separate metal from other materials. OK: fencing, pipe, aluminum door and window frames and lawn furniture. NO: car parts, appliances, or individual items over 40 lbs.

SPECIAL RECYCLABLES

TIRES

It's illegal to trash or burn tires, so recycle them at the Roseburg Landfill/Transfer Site or Reedsport Transfer Station.
Handling Fee: \$1/\$2 for passenger/pickup size.

WASTE RESIDENTIAL APPLIANCES

Working or not, all kinds are accepted at Norm's Appliances, 131 N. Old Pacific Hwy., Myrtle Creek. (For info, call 860-5915.)
Or take them to Roseburg Landfill/Transfer Site or Reedsport Transfer Station.
\$5 Fee: WASHER • DRYER • DISHWASHER • OVEN • WATER HEATER
\$15 Fee: REFRIGERATOR • FREEZER • AIR CONDITIONER

REUSABLE CLOTHING & HOUSEHOLD ITEMS

NOT ACCEPTED AT ROSEBURG LANDFILL/TRANSFER SITE
Take to any transfer site or thrift/resale store. Also check out the "Materials Exchange" page at www.co.douglas.or.us/recycle to find folks looking for all kinds of used items.

ANTIFREEZE

Collect in non-breakable containers and take to your nearest antifreeze recycling station.

USED MOTOR OIL & AUTO/BOAT BATTERIES

NOT ACCEPTED AT SUNRISE ENTERPRISES
Collect oil in non-breakable containers with tight lids. Empty into marked tanks and reuse containers or dispose of in trash cans.
All lead-acid batteries accepted free of charge at all Douglas County Transfer Stations.

WHERE TO RECYCLE

ROSEBURG LANDFILL/TRANSFER SITE
Off I-5, exit 121 – just follow the signs and put materials directly into marked bins.

DOUGLAS COUNTY TRANSFER SITES

Put items in bags or boxes (where appropriate) and place in recycling sheds or designated areas.
